On behalf of all the staff team here at St John's, I would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to all families for the kind and generous gifts, cards and kind words which we received at the end of last term. We really do appreciate the wonderful support which we receive from all in our community.

#### **Staffing**

This week we welcome Mr France, our new teacher, to St John's School. Mr France will be teaching Year 6 this year. We welcome back Mrs Weeks from maternity leave. Mrs Weeks will be supporting in Year 1 each morning, and in Year 3 each afternoon. Miss Tudor has a new role in school, and is now based in the school office as our school office administrator. We also welcome Mr Nicholson back to St John's. Mr Nicholson undertook a placement as part of his undergraduate degree last year, in Year 5. He has now successfully gained a teacher training place and will be working with Mrs Grainger, in Year 5, for the rest of the academic year.

#### **Autumn Term Events**

Please see the list of autumn term dates at the end of the newsletter. We will shortly be sending out the dates for the rest of the academic year, in order that parents can plan time off work. We will be adding events which arise throughout the year and are planning some parent workshops with a Maths focus in the autumn term, an English focus in the spring term and an RE and Catholic Life of the school focus in the summer term.

#### Appointments with staff

We always encourage parents to come in and speak with us should you have any concerns, no matter how big or small. Unfortunately, staff are unable to speak at length with parents at the start of the school day, as we need to ensure that all staff are in class for 8.55am in order to begin the school day promptly. Should you have any concern, your first port of call is the class teacher. You can arrange to make an appointment with your child's class teacher for a mutually agreeable time. Should you feel the matter has not been resolved, you can arrange to meet with the phase leader and then myself or Mrs Warters, our Deputy Head.

Phase leaders are as follows:

**Foundation Stage (Early and Late Foundation)** – Mrs Spittle

Key Stage One (Years 1 and 2) – Mrs Warters Key Stage Two (Years 3, 4, 5 and 6) – Miss Whitehouse

#### **Collecting Children**

We do still have a number of children throughout school who are collected by older siblings who attend St Wilfrid's. Unfortunately, as the school bus from St Wilfrid's arrives in Normanton after the end of our school day, this means that we have a number of children who are left unsupervised at the end of the day, often for up to half an hour or more, if the bus is late. We do not currently have childcare facilities for after school and rely on staff members sitting with these children until their older sibling arrives. The school day ends for foundation stage and key stage one at 3.15pm, and for key stage 2 at 3.20pm. Therefore, parents must ensure that appropriate childcare arrangements are in place for all children to be collected at these times.

Please ensure that, if you have been relying on older children, who attend St Wilfrid's, to collect younger siblings, that alternative arrangements are put in place from next week.

#### **Water Bottles**

We do encourage children to bring water bottles into school in order to keep hydrated during the school day. Children can buy water bottles from the school office for 50p. Alternatively, children may bring their own from home into school. Please ensure that your child's

water bottle is labelled with their name, and that it only contains still water, and not juice or flavoured water.

#### **Parking**

As we return to school, please do consider the local residents around our school, and remember to park considerately. For the safety of all our children, please drive and park with care and consideration for all the children in our school community.

#### **School Meals**

As part of the Universal Free Infant School Meals pledge, the children in Late Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 will continue to receive free school meals. If your child has now moved into Year 3, you will now need to pay for their school meals, unless you are in receipt of free school meals. The cost is £10.25 per week.
