#### **Maths Evening for Parents**

There will be a big focus, in our school development plan this year, on using and applying maths, which is a key feature of the new primary curriculum. This is a meeting for parents, not children, and will feature a mix of information sharing and practical hands-on activities. We will share information with regards to year group expectations and provide opportunities to engage in activities which your children will undertake to gain an insight into how we allow children to apply their maths learning.

#### **Jewellery and Nail Polish**

If your child has their ears pierced, stud earrings are allowed. However, hoop earrings are not allowed for health and safety reasons. No other jewellery should be worn. Children are not permitted to wear nail polish.

#### **School Grounds**

Please do not allow your child/ren to use the playground equipment at the end of the school day. Children should not be on the trim trail, and should not be going into the outdoor classroom. We have had some incidents of children riding bikes and scooters around the playground. Children must dismount their bike or scooter when entering the playground and walk to the bike shelter. Similarly, bikes and scooters should be walked across the playground at the end of the day.

Please do ensure that your children are closely supervised when entering and leaving school.

## **School Newspaper**

Mrs Grainger is leading in the publication of a school newspaper. She has appointed two chief editors, Maddy Grinsill and Nathan Everett in Year 6, and will shortly be appointing further editors. ## **School Book Bags**

Children are asked to bring a book bag to school in order to store books, planners, letters and homework. We do request a book bag, rather than any other style of bag, as our children store their bags in a book bag box within the classroom. Unfortunately, we do not have the capacity to store other bulkier bags. Book bags can be purchased from 'So This' in Normanton.

#### **Toys from Home**

Toys from home should not be brought into school. There are plenty of toys and games for our younger children to play with in class, and it would be a real shame if toys from home were damaged whilst in school. If children are ever asked to bring something in from home, a letter will be sent home to parents and carers.

#### **School Uniform**

Please do ensure that your child's uniform items are labelled clearly with their name. We have already had mix-ups when children are getting changed for PE.

Please note that trainers are not allowed as part of our school uniform. Children must wear black shoes. Trainers may be brought to school for outdoor PE only.
